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The Nine Common Beliefs of a K-5 Program



WE believe that -

Students need to experience all 5 areas of development:

- Aesthetic and Artistic
- Emotional and Social Development
- Intellectual Development
- Physical Development and Well-being
- Social Responsibility

We must have a plan for early intervention services to allow all students to be successful with learning.

Students need to be active and recognize the importance of learning through play and exploration.

Children have their own learning styles and will progress with their learning in different ways at different rates.

Children learn in one-to-one, small group and large group settings. These groups have specific learning objectives.

Teachers use the Ministry Performance Standards to assess and evaluate student's growth. Teachers assess for learning (to understand what the student can do and what needs to be taught).

Parents receive written reports about their child's progress.

When parents are active partners, the students are more successful.

Planning for teaching with other educators benefits students because it provides opportunities for teachers to develop and use new concepts and strategies.

CODE OF CONDUCT





At Strawberry Vale we create a culture of character where respect, patience, self-discipline, tolerance and the joy of learning are among the virtues that our children learn every day.

We promote a "Safe Learning Environment" where we all work together to solve conflicts and difficult situations. Behaviours such as bullying, harassment or physical aggression are not tolerated at Strawberry Vale. We provide a respectful, caring, and supportive environment in order for all children to succeed and learn.

Our Strawberry Vale Community of Learners always:

- cooperates so everyone works, learns and plays in a safe and nurturing environment
- helps create a positive, safe and healthy learning environment
- respects the rights and feelings of others
- uses polite, courteous language
- respects the personal space of others
- acts politely, respectfully and helps others
- models positive behaviours
- models self discipline
- models positive attitudes
- takes pride in themselves and always tries to do their best
- comes prepared for school and arrives on time
- models a positive, respectful manner at all school-related activities, on or off the school grounds and on the Internet
- takes personal responsibility for their actions
- makes responsible choices
- uses their W.I.T.S (W= Walk away, I = Ignore, T = Tell someone, S = Seek help)
- keeps their hands and feet to themselves
- understands that bullying is hurtful and is not acceptable at any time
- makes safe choices inside and outside of the school
- takes pride in their school
- keeps our school clean and tidy
- uses the waste management program
- cares for and respects our school and playground

This Code of Conduct outlines most, but not all, of the positive behaviours expected from all Community members.



The Virtues Project and WITS



Strawberry Vale Students use the Virtues Project and the WITS Program to create a culture of character, compassion and responsibility and to help with conflicts by considering other's perspectives and using problem solving skills. WITS stands for: W= Walk away, I = Ignore, T = Tell someone, S = Seek help.

As per the BC Human Rights Code, our Code of Conduct prohibits Discrimination based on any of the following grounds:

- age
- race
- color
- ancestry
- place of origin
- religion
- physical disability or mental disability
- family status
- marital status
- sex
- sexual orientation

Consequences for unacceptable behaviours:

The severity and frequency of unacceptable behaviour as well as the age and maturity of the student is always considered in determining appropriate consequences for the actions. For example:

- Consequences are planned carefully and are consistent and fair
- Actions taken, whenever possible, are preventative and restorative. We hope to provide the student with an opportunity to learn from his/her mistakes.
- As often as possible, students will be involved in developing meaningful consequences.
- Discrimination of any kind will not be tolerated.

Notification:

The seriousness and frequency of the behaviour will determine who will be notifying parents. (administration, teachers, other staff)

- Telephone calls, parent conferences, notes home etc. are all ways that we strive to keep open communication with parents.
- Consultation with the staff member involved, teacher, student administration, and counselor may occur.
- Administration will contact other parties for serious incidents.

We will contact:

- o Parents of students involved
- Deputy Superintendent, Mrs. Shelley Green
- o Police and other agencies as required by law

Strawberry Vale Elementary and the Greater Victoria School District will take all reasonable steps to prevent retaliation against a student.

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Some important reminders are:

Parking: Parents are asked not to park in the Drop Off & Pick Up Zone. If students are not ready to be picked up and you need to wait or go into the school, please park in the back parking lot or on the street.

Front Door: Please remember that students are to enter and leave the school by their assigned door, which is closest to their classroom. All visitors are asked to check in at the office.

Child Alert Program: This operates in the morning only. Please remember to contact the school if your child will be late or absent for the day. Please do this each day that the child is absent. email: <u>alert32@sd61.bc.ca</u> or call 250-479-5322

Emergency Plan: Fire drills are practiced each month. Preparation for an emergency such as earthquake or lockdown is continually worked on at a classroom and school level. Your PAC's work in this area is greatly appreciated.

Safety Patrol: Operates at 8:25-8:40 AM and 2:48 -3:08 PM daily **Bicycles:** Children must wear helmets and have a lock for their bikes. Bicycles must be walked when on school grounds.

Equipment: Hard balls (baseballs, softballs, lacrosse balls, etc.) are not to be brought to school. Appropriate playground equipment is available for children's use. Skate boards, scooters, and roller blades are not to be used during school hours.

Smoking: In accordance with the Capital Regional District Bylaw No. 2400, there is a ban on smoking on school grounds. This means that students, staff (including outside workers and contractors), parents and the public are expected to refrain from smoking in the building or on the fields, the blacktop, or the parking areas. Thank you for helping us support this bylaw.

Dogs: Please observe the Saanich By-Law stating that "Dog owners must remove dog excrement from school grounds". Dogs are not to be left unattended during school hours. All dogs must be on a leash at all times.

HEALTH

The Strawberry Vale staff cannot administer medicine of any kind without a form authorizing your child to take his/her own medicine under supervision. These forms are located in the office. Each child must have a medical card on file; the cards and medications are coordinated by the School Vice-Principal. Medications must be kept in the medical room, adjacent to the office.

In addition, the Vice-Principal, Emma Marley, maintains all health care plans. If your child has any life-threatening allergies or other medical needs please contact her at the school. A meeting will take place that involves the teacher, the family and Emma Marley to ensure your child's medical needs will be met. If your child is sick, he/she should remain at home for his/her comfort and the health of fellow students. If students are well enough to be at school, they are well enough to be outside at recess and lunch. If children become sick during the day, parents or caregivers will be called to come and pick them up. Please ensure all contact information is kept up-to-date.

Nutritious snacks sent to school with children are appreciated, as they can enhance the learning process.

No Child Without Program - MedicAlert

This program is offered at Strawberry Vale at no cost to families for students with medical conditions, allergy or special needs that should be communicated to medical personnel in an emergency. Application forms are available at the office.



This program is set up to ensure that all students arrive at school safely. A group of volunteers give their time each morning to supervise the program. It is very important that if your child will be late, absent or on vacation, that you please email (email: <u>alert32@sd61.bc.ca</u>) or phone us at 250-479-5322 before 8:40 AM. An answering machine is set up to take your call anytime, day or night. You will be asked to choose a box (1, 2, 3 or 4).

Box 1 (late) Child's name, division or teacher's name and expected time of arrival

<u>Box 2 (sick)</u> Child's name, division or teacher's name and continue to phone daily until your child returns to school

<u>Box 3 (appointment)</u> Child's name, division or teacher's name and anticipated time of arrival

<u>Box 4 (vacation)</u> If your child is going to be absent due to a vacation, please give child's name, division, or teacher's name, first and last day of vacation

You can also give any of the above information by email (<u>alert32@sd61.bc.ca</u>)

If a student does not arrive at the school and we have not been notified, we follow up with a phone call to the parents (at all numbers provided) to establish the reason for the absence and to confirm that the child is safe. For this reason home, emergency and work phone numbers need to be <u>kept up-to-date</u> at all times. Please notify the office of any changes to your phone numbers. Thank you.
