School Arrival:

We reviewed today the importance of the children remaining outside until the bell rings. Teachers are often not in their classroom or preparing for the day prior to 8:40 am. When the bell rings, some classes gather outside and go on a walk, while other classes wait for their teacher to bring them into the school. Other children come in on their own, hanging up coats and backpacks in their lockers and meet their teacher in their classroom. Please check with your child and/or teacher to determine their classroom practice.

When children are arriving at school, we ask that they use the same outside door for coming in the morning as they do from recess and lunch. This consistent usage reduces congestion in the hallways and enables our children to start their day in a calm environment.

School Departure

Many children meet their families at an agreed upon outside location rather than in the hallway. Many children leave our school from their outside classroom door while others use the nearest door to their classroom. Please discuss with your child which practice will work for your family.

Late Arrivals/Early Departures

Please ensure that your child comes to the office if they are late. They will be asked to sign in and take a late slip to class. Leaving prior to the bell, also requires a visit to the office so that your child can sign off and be on their way. This practice ensures that we know where your child is while in our care.

Thank you for completing the blue Emergency Release form that was included in your package of school forms. This information helps us in the event of an emergency to release to your child to identified adults.

This year, we will once again be purchasing emergency supplies for the school kiosk. **A donation of \$5.00 would be greatly appreciated.** Thank you in advance for your generosity. Please note "no child will be denied the opportunity to participate because of an inability to pay."

To help with our earthquake resources we ask that you **create a personal care pack for each of your children**. These care packs are kept in our earthquake kiosk and distributed to the children once we have evacuated and settled into our groups. Please include:

- Hard copy of a family photo
- Short personal note
- Small snack (fruit leather, gum, snack bar, etc)
- Small toy (optional)
- Socks

The pack itself needs to be placed in a medium sized zip lock bag. Please clearly write your child's name and division number on the outside of the bag for easy identification. Please ensure that you include 48 hours worth of any medication your child requires in a separate zip lock bag, clearly marked with your child's name.

Thank you so much for taking the time to create this care pack for your child. We appreciate the time it takes to create one, but strongly believe that it will be very helpful and comforting should the unfortunate event of an earthquake occur.
