Peter Monk, Children and Youth Mental Health team leader, and Quadra School are pleased to present an evening of information by experts and parents on children's mental health. Topics include: depression, anxiety, attention deficit, and conduct.

Experts will present on each topic for 10-15 minutes, followed by a 5 minute followup by parents who have children living these experiences. Many community organizations, such as the Friends Society, and the Single Parent Resource Center, will be present to share their role in the community during an open table sharing time directly after the presentations. Peter Monk and his team from CYMH will stay afterwards to answer questions that people may have. Free babysitting will be available for younger children. Tickets are free, but as space is limited, they must be reserved.
