B. Parent Education Fund:

SVE submitted a Joint Parent Education Fun grant with Eagle View for \$250/each. The grant was approved and the district will issue a cheque for the total amount of \$500 made out to SVE, since we wrote the cheque for the full amount of anxiety workshop (\$840). Jeni should receive the cheque within a couple weeks.

C. School-wide PAC funding

- Updates from Executive Meeting on School-wide PAC funding:
 - Exec approved \$500.00 for Seaquarium (this was approved at previous meeting)
 - At the executive meeting, the members identified funding school wide student experiences as a priority. They would like to see some of the monies raised at the Spring Fair allocated for a school wide student experience for the 2017-18 school year. Action: An executive member will attend the Nov 16th staff meeting to solicit suggestions for potential student experiences from the teaching staff. Teachers can make suggestions to be brought to the PAC as options for next school year.
 - At the executive meeting, the PACs ongoing support of the Nature Perimeter Pathway.
- School wide student experiences: one suggestion is an African Hand drumming assembly for the entire school (all students participate, show features 40 instruments from around world, and the show promotes cultural diversity, linguistic skills and respect in a fun and educational manner). The cost is \$750.00 for this experience. Once teachers are made aware of the event, Kristina will put Mr. Martin in touch with the presenter (Jordan of World Beat Drumming).
- Art Project this year for the garden (large mosaic) all students will help to create tiles and help put together mosaic to put together additional instructional place (Fancisco and Dean coordinating this). Mosaic: needing \$2000.00 (high end estimate-likely to be less than that)
