# 2. Teacher's Report

#### **Kirsten Brooks:**

- Her class is doing daily nature walks and have made a lot of nature observations with (animals, plants, neighbours, etc.) Walks help kids focus, lower/manage anxiety, lower blood sugar. Walks have been very helpful.
- One of her student's work was published in "Every Drop Counts"
- Mrs. Brook's class is adopting Beaver and Elk Lake and will do data collection on temperature, Ph, etc. They will map out areas where invasive species are causing a problem. Water problems are related to oxygen levels, algae, goose droppings etc
- Salmon Release last May—concerned that the salmon may not have made it due to the high water temperature.
- They are looking for other classes and people to get involved to help with the water shed there.
