## 4. Admin Report

#### Scott Thomas / Christine Patterson

- There are now 278 students enrolled in SVE spread across 13 divisions.
- Division 3 (grade %) welcomed A. Lyner as a teaching partner to K. Brookes.
- K. Brookes will be teaching environmental education on Tuesdays for all divisions. Divisions will be split into two groups with one group receiving environmental ed from now until February and the other group receiving environmental ed from February to June.
- Four new EA's have accepted permanent positions with the school.
- There are a total of 40 staff members at SVE this year.
- Staff had a very productive Pro D day back in September. There was a lot of discussion around the new school goal with regards to wording. For example, what does cultural inclusivity mean to the staff and school? Another discussion point was how to ensure that all students at SVE are seen and heard.
- School activities have started and include:
  - O Choir with Mr. Martin and Ms. Parlee 70 students in grades 3-5;
  - Cross Country 55 students in grades 3-5 with 35 racing;
  - Soccer grade 4-5 (co-ed); and,
  - O Strings 21 grade 5's
- Scott provided an overview of the history of strings within the school.
- Admin is working on having some activities over the lunch hour for the younger grades.
- Scott provided an indepth look at the new grading system that will be implemented across BC for K-9 students. As a summary, K-9 students will no longer receive letter grades but will be graded using a proficiency scale. Scott will be sending emails to families with more information as we get closer to report card time.
