### 4. Admin Report

- The main focus of the school right now is the Seussical. Right now, figuring out tickets and processing all the requests are taking up a lot of time from the admin team.
- In addition to Seussical preparations, various sports have started up including rugby, cross country, and track.
- Starting next week, the admin team will be busy starting the staffing process for next year.
- For the next school year, there will be 276 students spread across 13 divisions registered at SVE.
- Grade 5 transition meetings to middle school will be happening in the next couple of weeks.

### 5. Executive Update

- 5.1 Discuss results of the PAC Gaming Control Self-Assessment Questionnaire
  - The Compliance Division of the Gaming Policy and Enforcement Branch sent a self-assessment questionnaire that replaces the need for a formal audit. Andrew discussed the results of our self-assessment which included issues around record keeping, the need for financial documents to be in a public palace where they are accessible to everyone and a segregation of duties, i.e., approving e-transfers, writing the cheques and depositing cash.
  - The group discussed how the issues identified in the first bullet point can be addressed. Moving forward, the treasurer, Andrew, will start keeping records of receipts, emails, deposit slips, account summaries etc., in a binder that will stay at the school in the office. The PAC will ensure that these records are kept for the recommended 5 years. It was discussed that we do have a good system in place when it comes to counting money received from events, approving e-transfers, signing cheques, and depositing funds from events. Currently, the Accounts Clerk and the PAC treasurer both count the money separately and verify each other's numbers. When deposits are made at the bank, the bank also verifies the amounts. For e-transfers and the signing of cheques, the person receiving reimbursement never approves the funds. Melanie (PAC Secretary) and Chantelle (PAC Vice President) have signing authority.

9.3	School Sign	Melanie Styles	<ul> <li>Letters and a pole will be purchased this summer and advertising of events, Pro D days, early dismissal, and holidays can start in September.</li> </ul>
9.4	Swimming Lessons	Astrid Loucks	<ul> <li>The Commonwealth does offer swimming lessons to schools for students who are 8+ years. Younger children need adults in the pool with them.</li> <li>Swimming lessons are offered between 9-12:30pm and would be 30 minutes in length. If lessons start at 10am, Commonwealth can accommodate 4 lessons.</li> <li>Cost is \$20/ lifeguard and the requirement is 7 kids/ lifeguard.</li> <li>One class is ~20-15 students at a cost of \$25</li> <li>If multiple classes (50-75 students), cost is \$92</li> <li>Lessons would be 1 day / week</li> <li>Discussion around logistics.
