- Scott discussed what the staff talked about during the September pro D day. The topic was the power of school
 community. There will be a presentation by Scott and Carey at the November meeting to discuss how the PAC can
 assist admin in increasing parent engagement and therefore the school community.
- There is a healthy amount of school activities that are now up and running:
 - Choir 75 student across grades 3-5;
 - X-Country Running 45 students across grades 3-5;
 - Soccer 45 grade 4 and 5's;
 - O Dance Club 50 students; and,
 - o Rainbow Club
- The grade 5's are doing a lot to support the younger grades including helping the kindergartner's during the day with various things, helping with the spider guess, and helping to set up for various activities.
- Overall, it has been a very positive start to the school year with student engagement.
- Admin is also talking about how to make cultural celebrations more than just a 'check box' kind of thing such as pink shirt day. There is a desire to make things like this more meaningful.
- <u>Strings</u>: A question was asked about whether there will be strings this year. Scott discussed that there is a posting for a strings instructor but there has been no interest so the likelihood that there will be strings this year is low.



6. Treasurer's Report

- **6.1.** Financial Overview Update
 - As of September 30th, there is \$27,634 between the PAC's three accounts.
 - Welcome Back BBQ: revenue of \$620
- 6.2 Vote on Proposed 2024/2025 Budget
 - The draft budget was posted for 30 days. No feedback was given during this time. Minor revisions such as a small increase to the classroom fund. There are also some items listed that don't have an associated cost as it is unknown if these items will move forward, i.e., pond restoration, spring fair.
 - Motion to Approve the budget: Andrew; Seconded: Garnett
 - Unanimous yes by the group to approve the budget.

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- 6.3 Update on Gaming Grant for the 2024/2025 year
 - SVE received a grant amount of \$5,540
 - A financial summary to the Gaming Grant committee is due at the end of October.

7. Funding Requests

- 7.1. Discuss any update from the district on providing a quote for revitalization of the pond dock.
 - Quote from the district came in at \$6,300. This includes materials, installation, and labour. The existing footings will be used and the dock surface will be a lower maintenance material such as pressure treated wood.
 - Motion to Approve this quote: Jack; Seconded: Nadia. Unanimous yes by the group.
 - As of October 21st, the District anticipates moving ahead with this restoration starting the week of the 21st.
 - This will be added to the budget.

7.2 Indigenous Drums

- Scott discussed a meeting he had with the District's Indigenous liaisons around building 24 drums that would be gifted to the school. It would involve members from the PAC and staff to build by hand 24 drums during the February Pro D day.
- Admin requesting from the PAC \$2,000 towards building these drums.

9.4	Swimming Lessons	Astrid Loucks / Scott Thomas	 Astrid reached out to the Commonwealth and received the following information: Lessons will be offered between January and March for 4, 6, or 8 weeks; Ages: 8+; Lessons offered Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Friday between 9am and 12pm; 30 minute lessons, one division at a time; \$5/ child/ lesson A lengthy discussion by the group which generated more questions such as do we have the parents pay for the lessons or does the PAC cover this? How many students do we send at a time given there are 40 grade 3's and 56 grade 4's? How do we secure parent drivers each week for 4-8 weeks? How many adults do we need to support/ supervise changing afterwards? Do we just offer this to the grade 3's? Given that the discussion generated more questions, Scott asked that we come back to this in November so that he can talk through these questions with the staff and get their perspective. A final decision on this will be made at the November meeting.
9.5	Island Sexual Health Sessions/ Home Alone Program	Jack Buchanan	 Island Sexual Health: Carey reached out to Island Sexual Health and requested a February / March time frame. They will contact SVE 12 weeks before the requested time frame. As for the parent part of this program, Island Sexual Health recommended the parent session take place 10-14 days before the students receive their sessions. Home Alone: Jack reached out to Dirk Poppen who conducted the sessions this past May. He is offering \$39 / student (same pricing as last year) and the sessions would run over 2.5 days. Dirk is flexible on timing. Jack to connect with Dirk about scheduling the sessions for mid-April. An update to be given at the November meeting.
